Bonhomme posts career high single:

Robert Bonhomme tossed 266 in his 2nd game of the night on lanes 15 & 16 in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) at Marcin Bowl in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling action this past week to record his career highest single. He was 110 pins over average and takes the honours for high over average for a single game this week. This writer does not know if he has been 100 pins over average before for a single game but If this is his first time he qualifies for a Canadian Tenpin Federation watch for his achievement. His previous high single was 236. Last week he rolled his career high triple 604 (198-201-205) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League



(FTBMNML). Bonhomme is averaging 153 after 12 weeks in the MFFL and 163 for 28 games in the FTBMNML this year.

Beveridge records career top triple:



Trevor Beveridge rolled 667 (194-232-241) on lanes 27 & 28 in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) at Marcin Bowl to record his career sanctioned high triple. His previous high triple was 630 and his career high single is 279. He also had a 276 this year in the in league. Beveridge is averaging 188 after 12 weeks of bowling in the MFFL.

Legault bowls personal high single:



Noah Legault bowled 212 (66 pins over average) in his last game of the day on lanes 19 & 20 in the Phantom Youth Bowling League at Marcin Bowl to record his personal high single game. His previous high single was 191 and his high triple is 541. Noah started bowling in the HiWay Bowl Youth Phantom Bowling Program at age 5 and he has been knocking down the pins for 6 years. He is averaging 146 after 11 weeks of bowling.

Thomas is high over average:



Rob Thomas fired 685 (259- 84 pins over average – 223-203 – 160 pins over average for three games) on lanes 19 & 20 in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men’s League (FTBMNML) at Marcin Bowl to take the honours for high over average for three games in the LCTA this past week. Thomas started bowling 5 pin at age 12 with his friends in Stratford because there were no 10 pin bowling houses in the city. Rob bowled 5 pin for 6 years then switched to 10 pin on the encouragement from his girlfriend and

parents. He has bowled 10 pin for 20 years but took a few years off from bowling. He returned to the lanes three years ago when his friend Mike Shoults said they needed another bowler for the team in the FTBMNML. Thomas is a right handed bowler with career sanctioned high scores of 729 and 298. Last year in the FTBMNML he finished the year with a 187 average for 87 games. This year he is averaging 180 for 30 games bowling on “The Wine Well” team with Mike Shoults, Jamie Culley and Brian Mundt. His additional bowling moments have been his participation in the Ontario Tenpin Bowling Association provincial tournaments and fund raising tournaments. His other sporting interests are baseball, golf and hockey. Thomas is the plant manager at Trillium Distribution.

Shephard’s game picking up:

Mike Shephard hurled 726 (238-242-246) on lanes 23 & 24 in the Best Wiring Classic League (BWCL) at Marcin Bowl to post the high triple of the week in



LCTA bowling competition. Mike's game is picking up speed as it was his 2nd consecutive 700 as last week he bowled 729 (229-224-276) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League. It was his 3rd 700 of the season. Shephard is averaging 205 for 30 games in the BWCL bowling with team members Mike Jones and Shane Chapman.

Legault nipped to second spot:



Pat Legault fired 725 (278 – 74 pins over average – 214-233) on lanes 17 & 18 in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (FTBMNML) at Marcin Bowl to register the second high triple of the week in LCTA bowling action. Legault's game is also starting to pick up as last week he rolled 717 (234-225-258) in FTBMNML giving him his first two 700's of the year. Legault is averaging 207 for 30 games in the league this year. Legault has 4-300's (sanctioned) to his credit

posted in the old American Bowling Congress and the Canadian Tenpin Federation.

Adamson slips to third place:

Kyle Adamson tossed 707 (226-244-237) on lanes 27 & 28 in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (FTBMNML) to post the third high triple of the week. Louie Willemsen wheeled 705 (222-257 – 87 pins over average - 226) on lanes 27 & 28 in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men’s League to record the week’s fourth high triple. It was Louie’s first 700 of the season. He is now averaging 176 for 30 games bowling on the “Bluewater Ideas” team with David Paquette, Tony Olsen and Kyle Adamson. 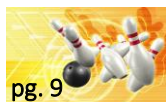

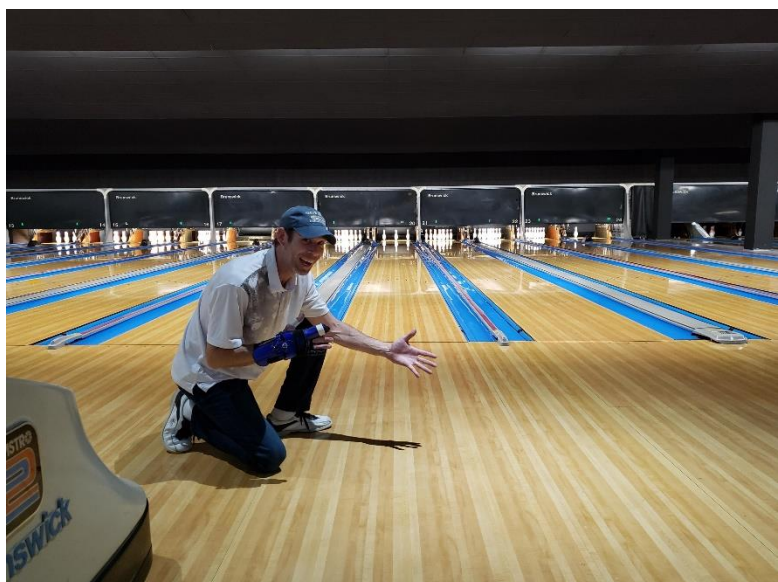

Featured Bowler of the Week:

The LCTA featured bowler of the week is Dan Chopp. Dan started bowling 46 years ago at the ripe age of 7 at the Pin Deck Lanes bowling

5 pin for 2 years and then switched to the Sarnia Minor Athletic Association 10 pin bowling program at Marcin Bowl. Over the years Chopp has become a strong competitive 10 pin bowler and he credits a lot of his success on the lanes to his coaches Dave LeClair, Roger Croteau, Tom Stokes and Tom Davidson. Some his most memorable bowling moments are bowling 3-300's in the 2015-2016 season in the Border City Men's League which is now called the Sarnia Produce Border City Men's League (SPBCML). Another memorial occasion etched in his mind is telling Tom Davidson he bowled a 300 with the last ball Tom drilled for him before he passed away. Chopper also remembers bowling his first 300 with Bucket (Jim Bourgeois) by his side encouraging him that "it was his time". And of course he still remembers the two 7-10 splits that he converted. Dan's career sanctioned high scores are 797 and 300 -6 (1 in the American Bowling Congress and 5 in the Canadian Tenpin Federation). Five of these perfect games have been posted in the SPBCML. He also has sanctioned scores of 298-1 and 299-3 and 7 unsanctioned 300's. Chopp has consistently been a tough competitor on the lanes carrying a solid average. Starting in the 2010-2011 season and cascading upwards his averages in the SPBCML (minus the 2021-2022 season when he did not bowl taking a year off to reset his game but found he missed the sport too much) were 225-225-220-228-221-223-219-215-222-213-220-219.

Dan said "I love to bowl for the fun of just getting out with the boys. I'm not as competitive as I used to be bowling a mere three games a week. I have much respect for all my fellow bowlers and my old coaches who have helped me strive to be better in this sport. Family priorities have made it more a fun outing now, less competition but with no regrets"

Dan is happily married for 24 years to Melissa (Hobday) and they have two sons Nick and Aiden. His oldest son Nick is graduating from the CEPET (Centre for Elite Expertise and Training) program this year. His youngest son Aiden is planning on going to college next year. Like this writer, both of his sons are



not bowlers. They also have two Aussie shepherds which Dan says are “like two more children”. Dan’s formal training was in Graphic Illustration. Chopper has worked at Cabot for the last 13 years in the warehouse packing and shipping department and also works in the operations department (Grinder Relief Operator). Before that he was a Pipe Operator at Fibrex which closed shop in 2010. Chopp enjoys anything historical in nature and likes watching documentaries pertaining to such subjects as wars, the Titanic and old ships. He said he loves old cars and admits he has had a few over the years.

In closing Dan said “my future goals are seeing my sons off to be successful men, growing older with my beautiful wife and making it in one piece to retirement somewhere warm where I can still bowl until I can’t walk or my arm falls off”.
