Weekly Highlights

Friis perfect at tournament:

Sarnia born bowler Jill Friis (Clendenning) had a super day at the Jack Erb Memorial Ontario Seniors Handicap Tournament (JEMOSHT) held on October 28 and 29 at Burlington Bowl this past weekend. This tournament is a singles division only where the participants roll two sets of three games. The winners of each division get to represent Ontario in the United States Bowling Congress Senior Championships (USBCSC) which is a national event for bowlers who have qualified through their states or provincial senior tournament. The tournament will be held at Western Bowl in Cincinnati Ohio from July 30 to August 4, 2024. Jill fired a perfect game in her first game in her first set ending up with 711 (300-220-191). It was her career 9th perfect game. In her second set she fired 751 (249-235-267) for a scratch total of 1462 for 6 games and an average of 243.6. Unofficial results show her in first place in the women's



60-64 division with a scratch total of 1462 and 1642 with handicap. If the results don't change (highly unlikely that they will) she will be off to Cincinnati once again. In the 2019 JEMOSHT, Jill won the 55-59 division sending her to the USBCSC in Cincinnati where she ended up in 5th place in her division. Friis is a member of the London & District Tenpin Bowling Association and has been the association's Women's Bowler of the Year 19 times. In 2016 she was the Canadian Women's Bowler of the Year. Jill bowls as a spare in the Best Wiring Classic League at Marcin Bowl on Sunday morning along with her husband Kerry and she is averaging 202 for 15 games this year in the league.

McLellan tops in tournament:



Jackie McLellan was victorious in the Jack Erb Memorial Ontario Seniors Handicap Tournament (JEMOSHT) held at Burlington Bowl this past week end. She was bowling in the Super Seniors Division (+75) posting scores of 114-139-139-158-141-158 for a scratch score of 849 and with handicap 1503. The scores are unofficial but it is highly unlikely that they will change. She has won the right to go to Cincinnati to participate in the United States Bowling Congress Senior

Championships (USBCSC) on July 30 to August 4, 2024. Jackie has been very successful in the JEMOSHT over the years winning her division 8 times including this year. She has attended the USBCSC tournament 4 times winning it once in Reno, Nevada. By winning in Reno she received a crystal bowling ball and \$1000.00. She also had a 6th place finish at the USBCSC another year. She was unable to attend the USBCSC 3 times for some reason or another but is hoping to attend the tournament in Cincinnati in 2024.



Sinclair and Cole place second in tournament:



Neil Sinclair and Bill Cole took part in the Jack Erb Memorial Ontario Seniors Handicap Tournament at Burlington Bowl this past weekend and placed second in their respective divisions. The results are unofficial but will probably not change. If by chance the winners of these divisions are unable to go to Cincinnati, the second place winners would have the opportunity to take their place and represent Ontario in

the United States Bowling Congress Seniors Championship.

Sinclair was participating in the Super Seniors Division (+75) rolling 233-192-208-233-200-175 for a scratch total of 1241 and with handicap 1481.



Cole was participating in the 60-64 Division tossing 138-253-213-168-219-215 for a scratch total of 1206 and with handicap 1518.

Monk posts career high scores:



Meaghan Monk tossed 584 (156-225- 104 pins over average – 203 – 221 pins over average for three games) on lanes 19 & 20 in the Thursday Night Mixed League (TNML) at Marcin Bowl to post her career high scores in Lambton County

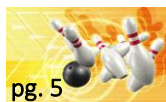
Best fires low 700 series:

This writer checked the LCTA average books for the last 13 years to see how she did average wise in the TNML. Her averages for the last 13 years starting from the 2011-2012 season and cascading upwards (minus the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 seasons due to Covid) were 166-167-170-165-165-158-158-157-153-154 and 152. This year she is averaging 152



for 27 games in the TNML. She is a right handed bowler with career highest sanctioned scores of 613 and 264. Betty's other sporting interests which she plays are golf and pickleball. She retired from Dow Chemical after 34 years of service.
