Lapointe senior is king of the lanes:



Jim Lapointe fired 785 (277-258 -250 - 145 pins over average for three games) on lanes 9 & 10 in the RCAFA 403 Wing Mixed League at Hi-Way Bowl to record the high triple of the week in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling action. Jim is averaging 213 in the league after 31 weeks on the lanes. Jim also bowls in the Thursday Night Men's League at Marcin Bowl and is averaging 218 after 96 games. Jim is best known for the first person to bowl back to back perfect games in league play in the LCTA which replaced the old Sarnia and District Tenpin Bowling Association. He

accomplished the feat in 2016. Jim has 6-300's and 3-800's to his credit.

Sirois a close second:

Stephane Sirois tossed 783 (298 –91 pins over average - came high leaving 4-7 pins – 279 – 162 pins over average for three games) on lanes 21 & 22 in the Border City Men's League at Marcin Bowl to post the second high triple of the week in LCTA action. He also tied Jim Creasor for the second high single of the week and Tony Spano for the week's high over average for three games. Stephane is bowling in three leagues this year carrying consistent averages (in brackets): Marcin Sunday Morning Men's League (210), Marcin Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (209) and Marcin Border City Men's League (208). Stephane has 2-300's to his credit.

Lapointe junior slides into third:

Ben Lapointe rolled 760 (279-258-223 – 130 pins over average for three games) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League at Marcin Bowl to post the third high triple of the week. It was his 28th 700 series (17 in adult leagues and 11 in youth league) in his young bowling career for the twenty year old right handed bowler. He is averaging 213 after 51 games in the league. He is also averaging 213 after 57 games in the Phantom Youth Senior

Division at Hi-Way Bowl. Ben experienced the excitement of bowling his first perfect game this season and now has his sight on the difficult 800 series.

Salmons is almost perfect:

Matt Salmons hurled 299 – 83 pins over average - unyielding 6 pin in the Sunday Morning Men's League (SMML) at Marcin Bowl to record the high single in LCTA bowling action this past week. He was bowling on lanes 19 & 20 in his first game of the day and finished the day with a fine 725 (234) triple. Matt is carrying a 216 average after 57 games in the SMML. He also bowls in the Marcin Thursday Night Men's League and is averaging 209 after 73 games this season. Matt has 3- 299's, 4-300's and 1-800 (803) to his credit.

Creasor is two pins shy:

Jim Creasor rolled 298 – 79 pins over average – stubborn 2-8 pins in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) at Marcin Bowl to share the second high single of the week. He was bowling on lanes 17 & 18 in his second game of the night and finished the night with 703 (258). Jim is no stranger to bowling perfect games as he has 23-300's and 25-800's in Canadian/ American league and tournament action. He has three memorable bowling accomplishments: In the 2008 Ontario Tenpin Bowling Association Provincial Tournament in St. Catharines, he fired back to back 300's and 269 to end up with a super 869 triple.

The Canadian Tenpin Federation record is held by Bill Kirton (889). He also tied the Port Huron Tenpin Bowling Association triple record (868) in 2017 and established a new LCTA triple record (876) in 2015. Jim is currently averaging 219 after 81 games in the BMNML.

Legault is tops for the ladies:

Karyne Legault fired 688 (227-235-226) in the Tuesday Night Ladies League to lead the way for the ladies this week. Karyne, a right handed bowler, is having a solid year averaging 205 after 87 games. She also experienced the thrill of bowling her first perfect game this season. Her personal high triple is 797 (oh so close to that dream 800 series).

Spano shares high over average:

Tony Spano wheeled 699 (277 – 97 pins over average – 221 – 162 pins over average for three games) in the Sunday Morning Men’s League (SMML) at Marcin Bowl to share the honours for high over average for three games with Stephane Sirois. In the late 1950’s Tony got involved in bowling by setting 5pins to earn some pocket money at the National Bowling Lanes on Christina Street. He started bowling 10pin in the 60’s at

Northgate Bowl qualifying numerous times for Sarnia Cable TV, channel 6 bowling competition. In the 70’s he bowled 10 pin at Lake Huron Lanes in the Blue Water Men’s League winning the high triple award with 694 and the Sarnia Classic League at Hi-Way Bowl where he won the high single award with 279. In the 1997-1998 annual Sarnia & District Bowling Association tournament, his team won the Team Event. (It was not unusual to have about 60 teams in the tournament back then). Tony has had 11 strikes in a row 5 times but has not been able get that perfect game. However he feels he has many more games left in his right arm to achieve that 300. His career high scores are 299 and 768. Tony is currently averaging 181 after 87 games in the SMML. He also



partakes in the Marcin Thursday Night Men's League and is currently averaging 181 after 84 games.

Burr is 100 pins over average:



Sean Burr wheeled 277 – 101 pins over average in the RCAFA 403 Wing Mixed League at Hi-Way Bowl. Sean started bowling at age 6 with his brother in the Hi-Way Bowl Junior Bowling program and remained in the program until age 21. Then there was a hiatus from bowling when he re-located to western Canada for employment. He returned 4 years ago to his beloved Hi-Way Bowling House and bowls full time in the RCAFA League and spares in other leagues if required. Upon his return to Sarnia looking for permanent employment, he spent 2 years as a grease monkey/assistant mechanic at Hi-Way Bowl where he learned about the back-end of a bowling lane. This gained him the knowledge he needed to help set up an outdoor “Bowling Lane” in his boss’ driveway as a charity fundraiser for the Cancer Society for two consecutive years. Sean believes his highest single is 279 and a 600 triple which he shot as a junior bowler. This year Sean finally took the big step by becoming engaged to his soul-mate “Zoe” and with his life change and improved bowling game everything is just BURR-FECT.

Jean fires personal best score:



Hollie-Anne Jean tossed 625 (202-212-211 – 136 pins over average for three games) in the Youth Intermediate Division (YID) at Marcin Bowl to post her career first 600 triple. Her previous high triple was 588 and her highest single is 248. Hollie started bowling at age 5 in the Marcin Bowl Youth Bowling program and has been enjoying the great sport of tenpin bowling for 12 years. She has some proud achievements to her credit including the 2015-2016 SMAA Youth bowler of the year and she was voted as the female athlete of the year for grade 9 & 10 in her school. She was also presented with the IODE (Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire) grade 9 achievement award and a Citizen Award. Hollie is presently averaging 164 after 87 games in the YID.



Mundy rolls personal high scores:

Olivia Mundy achieved her first 200 game and her first 500 triple when she rolled 519 (169-150-200) in the Phantom Youth Senior Division at Hi-Way Bowl this past Saturday. Olivia started bowling only 5 years ago at age 13 in the Airey Lanes Youth program at Courtright. When Airey Lanes closed two years ago, she joined the Hi-Way Phantom Youth League and has improved her average from under 100 to the current 121. Her other interest was youth curling which she participated in until she reached the age where no local curling was available for her division. After doing a co-op program at a local canine retreat in the dog grooming field, she was able to land a job at a local animal shelter. Olivia, along with her fellow team mates, are getting excited about the upcoming Youth Provincial Tournament in Mississauga in May. She hopes to repeat her high scores to earn some of the scholarship money should she wish to switch careers in the future.

Provincial Youth Tournament:

The Ontario Provincial Joyce Woolgar Memorial Family Twosome Tournament was held at Classic Bowl in Mississauga on Sunday February 3, 2019 with 103 youth bowlers and their adult partners from across Ontario competing for scholarship money for future education purposes. Fourteen youth from Marcin Bowl and eighteen youth from Hi-Way Bowl took part in the tournament. her mother entered with a 110 average and bowled 134-137-120-168. Tessa Wheeler and adult partner Dennis Wheeler from Hi-Way Bowl captured third place with a score of 2081 and \$275.00 dollars. 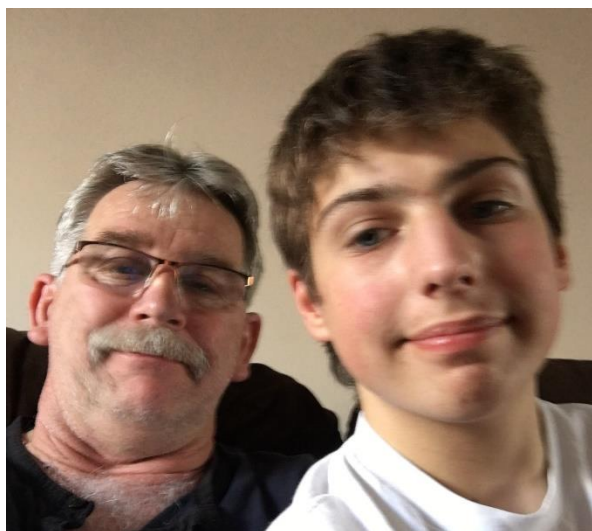
Adult/youth/Girl:
