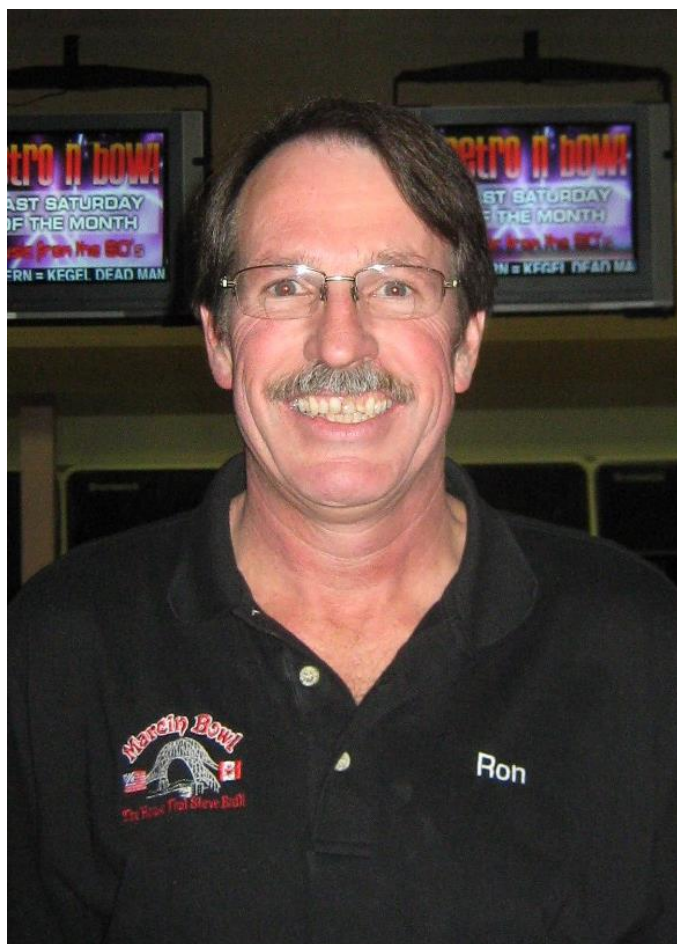

Weekly Highlights

Vandermeer is king of the lanes:

Rob Vandermeer wheeled 781 (247 – 289 – 72 pins over average -245 - 130 pins over average for three games) in the Border City Men's League (BCML) at Marcin Bowl to be the king of the lanes in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling action this past week. Vandermeer is another bowler who did not come through any organized youth bowling program but picked up the game on his own and tips from fellow bowlers. He is bowling in only one league this year and spares as required. He is a strong consistent right handed bowler with his averages from the BCML from the last nine years backing up his consistency: 213 – 212 – 211 - 216 - 215 – 214 - 210 - 202- 210. This year he is off to a great year averaging 222 after 27 games. Rob has a career 3- 300's, 1-299 with a high triple of 793 in his pocket, all recorded in the BCML.



Adamson takes second place:

Kyle Adamson fired 769 (277-258-234 – 142 pins over average for three games) in the Sunday Morning Men's League (SMML) at Marcin Bowl to take second place in the high triple department this week in LCTA bowling activity. Adamson is bowling in three leagues this year with his averages and games in brackets: SMML (215/24), the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (214/21) and the Border City Men's League (204/27). Kyle is a highly competitive right handed bowler who usually plays between the 5-10 boards with his ball entering the pocket with explosive power. He has 7-300's and 6-800's to back up his bowling ball power.

Sirois slides into third:

Stephane Sirois hurled 745 (247-262-236) in the Border City Men's League at Marcin Bowl to register the third high triple in LCTA activity this week. Sirois returned to the lanes this week after taking off a month to go moose hunting (there will be moose burgers on the table) and visit family in Quebec. It looks like he also may have been practicing his game when on vacation. Sirois is another bowler who didn't start bowling in a youth program but started enjoying this great sport at age 26 and has been bonding with the boys on the lanes for 28 years. He is also off to a great start averaging 224 after 18 games. The right handed kegler has 2-300's to his credit and his career highest triple is 791.



Belliveau drops to fourth spot:

Pierre Belliveau rolled 741 (276 - 76 pins over average – 245 -220 – 141 pins over average for three games) in the Sunday Morning Men’s League (SMML) at Marcin Bowl to record the fourth high triple in LCTA bowling action this past week. Belliveau started bowling at the young age of 5 going through the YBC (Youth Bowling Canada) program in Wallaceburg/Chatham and also bowled in the youth bowling program at the

now defunct Lakeside Bowl in Sarnia. The lefty from London has career sanctioned high scores of 300 - 1 (October 19, 2017) and 799 (November 27, 2017) both recorded at Marcin Bowl. He also has a 299 which he posted last year in the SMML. He is averaging 206 after 24 games this year.

Lapointe leads the youth:

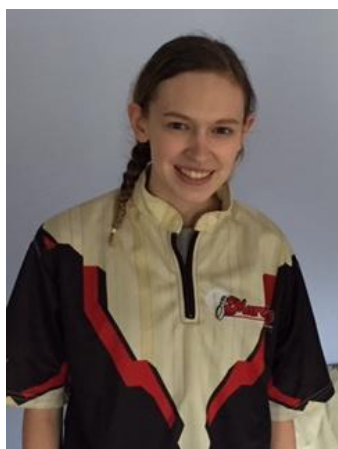
Ben Lapointe tossed 723 (269 - 208 - 246) in the Junior Bowlers League Senior Division at Hi-Way Bowl to lead the youth bowlers this week in LCTA bowling play. This writer is keeping tabs on this great, high revs, right handed, twenty – one year old bowler’s 700 triples and he now has 41-700 plus triples (27 in adult leagues and 14 in youth leagues). He has 1-300, 2-299’s and 3-298’s with his highest triple at 787 (243-265- 279) which he recorded in the Bluewater Monday Night Men’s League at Marcin Bowl last year. Lapointe started rolling the ball at age 4 under the watchful eyes of Mel and Shirley Matthews who have been dedicated instructors to the youth bowlers at Hi-Way Bowl for 37 years. Many of these bowlers have become solid competitive bowlers while others are simply enjoying the great sport.



Storozuk rolls personal high triple:

Doc Kevin Storozuk rolled 692 (226-241-225) in the Border City Men's League (BCML) at Marcin Bowl last week but was given only an Honourable mention in last week's bowling report as this writer was unaware of his personal accomplishment. His triple was his personal high score. Storozuk started bowling 5-pin at age 3 in the YBC (Youth Bowling Canada) program in a "town way up north" he said. His granny owned a bowling alley and that was the perfect spot to keep him occupied and out of

trouble. As the years progressed, Kevin ended up going to University and eventually became a chiropractor, a bone cracking experience he has been doing for 27 years. He started bowling 10-pin 20 years ago when he joined the BCML. Storozuk has been a relatively consistent bowler in the BCML for the last 10 years. His averages starting in the 2010-2011 season and subsequent years were 183, 181, 180, 183, 182, 182, 181, 189, 181 and 184. This year he is off to a great start averaging 200 after 18 games. His personal highest game is 268. Storozuk's other interests include skiing and cycling.

Jean records personal best scores:

Hollie-Anne Jean tossed 626 (257 – 93 pins over average – 134 pins over average for three games) in the Youth Intermediate Division at Marcin Bowl to register both her personal highest triple and single game. Her scores were also good for the female youth high scores of the week. Her previous high scores were 625 and 248. Hollie has been with the Marcin Bowl Junior Program (MBJP) for approximately thirteen years starting as a Junior Bantam at the age of five. Last year she finished with a 172 average for 78 games. This year she is averaging 169 for 24 games. She is the granddaughter Carol and Gil Jean who have

been dedicated coaches working with the junior bowlers at Marcin Bowl for about 38 years after coaching at the defunct Northgate Bowl Lanes for 3 years.

Scott tops her high triple:

McKenna Scott rolled 565 (219 – 62 pins over average) in the Intermediate Division at Marcin Bowl to beat her previous high triple of 516. Her personal best single game is 231. McKenna started bowling 5 years ago at age 12 in the Marcin Bowl Youth Bowling Program in the 2015-2016 bowling season. Her final average in the Junior Division for that year was 84. This year she is averaging 164 after 24 games. She is following the footsteps of her father “Paul” and mother “Johanna” both who love the great sport of 10-pin bowling enjoying the friendship of fellow bowlers in league and tournament play. Besides bowling McKenna also keeps herself busy with school work and school sports (curling and badminton).

Koundakjian is 100 pins over average:

Werner Koundakjian wheeled 235 (103 pins over average – 149 pins over average for three games) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men’s League (BMNML) at Marcin Bowl to record the week’s high over average for one game. Koundakjian is a relatively new bowler in the LCTA having started participating in organized league bowling two years ago in the BMNML. His first year average was 140 with his average increasing to 152 in his second year. This year he is averaging 139 after 21 games. He bowls on the “Lambton Ford Mustangs” team with fellow bowlers Warren Knights, Paul Eddleston and Jerry Meneray.
