



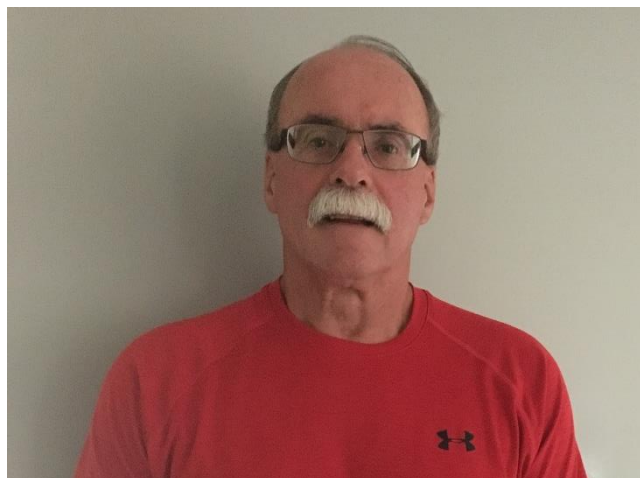

### **Local bowlers are champions in Adult Provincial Tournament:**

Congratulations to the three Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) adult bowlers who came home champions from the 2018-2019 season closing Ontario Provincial Handicap Tenpin Bowling Tournament which was held at Leisure Lanes in Oshawa on the weekends of May 18/19 and May 25/26. The tournament consisted of women's singles/ doubles/teams, men's singles/doubles/ teams and mixed doubles/teams.



In the Men's Single Division (MSD), Mike Casey, who bowls in the Thursday Night Mixed League (TNML) at Marcin Bowl entered the tournament with a 132 average. He fired games of 256-148-167 for 571 scratch/ 324 handicap for a total of 895 to win first place and \$1,565.00. Mike did not go through a youth bowling program but in his youth years he bowled every Thursday night with his parents at

Mitton Street Bowl. He has been participating in league play for the last 12 years. He started at the defunct Airey Lanes in Courtright for seven years then switched to the Marcin TNML. He has averaged between 130 and 141 over the years. CONGRATULATIONS Mike on winning the Singles Division.

Second place went to Aaron Guertin from Ottawa. He had an outstanding series hurling games of 259-290-276 for 823 scratch/57 handicap for 880 good for 2<sup>nd</sup> place



and \$785.00. Other LCTA bowlers cashing in the singles division were Steve Peters 22<sup>nd</sup> – 811 (\$69.00), Jim Burgess 22<sup>nd</sup> – 811 (\$69.00), Terry Mundy 45<sup>th</sup> -784 (\$33.50), Kyle Adamson 45<sup>th</sup> – 784 (\$33.50) and Bill Cole 57<sup>th</sup> -777 (\$27.00). There were 355 entries in the MSD.

In the Men's All Events Division (MAED), Mike Casey and Steve Turcotte Jr. from Toronto were tied for first place with 2430 and each received \$465.00. CONGRATULATIONS once again Mike. There were 276 entries in the MAED.

In the Men's Double Division (MDD), CONGRATULATIONS goes to LCTA bowlers Jason Armitage and Terry Mundy who rolled

In the Ladies Double Division (LDD), LCTA bowlers Jenny Kearns and Denise Thomas rolled games of 378-382-431 for a scratch total of 1191/357 handicap for a total of 1587 (31 pins out of 1<sup>st</sup> place) good for 5<sup>th</sup> place and \$225.00. Jocelyn VanEkeren and Karyne Legault ended up in 10<sup>th</sup> place tossing games of 378-382-431 for a scratch total of 1191/357 handicap for a total of 1548 and \$120.00. There were 98 entries in the LDD.

In the Ladies Single Division (LSD), Jenny Kearns wheeled games 151-152-154 for a scratch total of 457/360 handicap for a total of 817 good for 10<sup>th</sup> place and \$125.00. Other LCTA ladies cashing in the singles were Denise Thomas 29<sup>th</sup> – 785 (\$43.00),

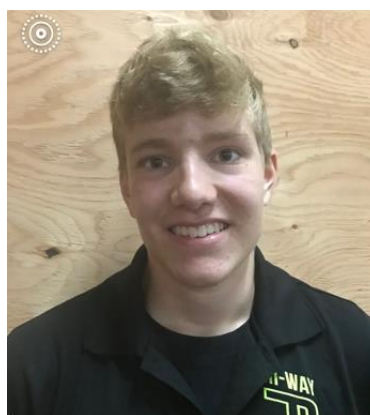
### Youth Provincial Champions:

CONGRATULATIONS to the four LCTA Youth bowlers who came home champions in the annual Doug Imms Memorial Ontario Youth Handicap Provincial Tournament held this year in Mississauga on the weekends of May 4/5 and May 11/12. The tournament consisted of teams (92), doubles (139) and singles – Boys (240) – Girls (121) in different divisions according to age groups.

In the Girl's Singles "D" Division, Emily Hannah from Hi-Way Bowl returned home with first place in her hands after rolling a score of 791 (scratch 431 /Handicap 360) to earn \$200.00 dollars in scholarship money. The second place bowler with a score of 760 was from Bramalea Lanes. There were 21 entries in the division.



In the Doubles Event "C" Division, Howard captured 1587 702) to

each earn a \$150.00 scholarship. They defeated the second place team from Classic Bowl who rolled 1560. The LCTA team of Montee Henry and Dion Maness from Marcin Bowl fired 1557 (scratch 825/ Handicap 732) to take 3<sup>rd</sup> place and each a \$75.00 scholarship. There were 51 entries in the division.





In the boys All Events “E” Division, Noah Wyville from Hi-Way Bowl, was the prince of the lanes as he captured first place and a \$150.00 scholarship. Noah entered the tournament with a 65 league average and received 471 pins handicap in each of his single, double and team events. In his single event, he tossed 307 scratch (112 pins over average) plus his handicap gave him 778. In his doubles event, he posted another 307 scratch and a 778 total. In the team event, he rolled 293 scratch (98 pins over average) and with his handicap he scored 764. In all three events he recorded 907 scratch (322 pins over average) and a grand total of 2320 with handicap. Noah also placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Boys Singles “E” Division bringing home \$100.00 in scholarship funds.

**Lefty brings home more medals:**

Kevin Schofield returned home from Chengdu China with four more medals in his pocket from the World Police and Fire Games (WPFPG) which he attended in mid-August. The WPFPG is an Olympic-style, International multi-sport competition that is held every two years and is open to active and retired law enforcement and fire personnel throughout the world. It is the second largest sporting event next to the summer Olympics. This year there were 10,500 athletes from 79 different countries competing in 63 different sporting events. Kevin had previously won 9 gold medals, 5 silver medals and 5 bronze medals in 9 years of competition at these games in Indianapolis, Barcelona Spain, Quebec City, Vancouver, Australia, Belfast Ireland, Fairfax Virginia, New York City and Los Angeles. The lefty had a super tournament in China bringing home 2 gold and 2 silver medals giving him a career 11 gold and 7 silver medals to go along with his 5 bronze medals. Kevin was the only Canadian competing in 10-pin bowling. His doubles partner was from Ohio and his team partners were from California. His gold medals came in the Grand Masters Open Singles and the Grand Masters Open All Events. His silver medals came in the Team Open Division and the Step Ladder Finals Open. Kevin said the tournament was supposed to be held in a new bowling centre but it wasn't completed in time so they had to bowl in an older centre with very poor air conditioning. Outside temperature was 100 degrees while inside the bowling centre the temperature hovered around 85. The high inside temperature made for difficult bowling conditions. Kevin said he pretty much had to alter his lane shot every three to four frames every game. Each division had a 5 game block so he bowled 15 games plus the final game in the Step Ladder Open Finals (SLOF) averaging 223 with his lowest game being 205 and his highest 257. Schofield was the overall high qualifier for his 15 games and had the number one seed spot in the SLOF going into the final game. However, he lost to a young bowler from China and got the silver medal. CONGRATULATIONS on the SUPER bowling Kevin.



**Sirois almost perfect:**

Stephane Sirois rolled 299 (solid, stubborn 10-pin) in his second game on lanes 19 & 20 in the Sunday Morning Men's League (SMML) at Marcin Bowl to record the high single of the week and the first HONOUR score in the LCTA season this year. He finished the day with a 740 (236) triple which was also good for the week's high triple. Stephane is bowling in two leagues this year – the SMML and the Border City Men's League (BCML) His final averages in the leagues last year (with games bowled in brackets) were SMML 211 (99), BCML 208 (87) and the Marcin Bluewater Monday Night Men's League

210 (54). He has 2-300's and a 298 to his credit.
