Weekly Highlights

Romanik fires week's high triple:



Justin Romanik fired 772 (270 - 69 pins over average – 226 – 276 – 75 pins over average – 169 pins over average for three games) in the Bar 10 Thursday Night Mixed League (B10TNML) on lanes 17 & 18 at Marcin Bowl to record the high triple in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling action this past week. It was his second 700 this year in the LCTA as he previously rolled 726 (233-258-235). He nipped his previous high triple of 771 and his career high single is 300 (2). Romanik is averaging 201 after 30 weeks this year in the (Bar10TNML) bowling with team members Kylie Barnes, Janette Fader, Maunisha Rana and Norm Lafreniere. Last year in the Bar10TNML he averaged 199 for 24 games.

Wright rolls new high triple:

Daniel Wright hurled 597 (169-181-247 – 99 pins over average – 153 pins over average for three games) in the Phantom Youth League (PYL) on lanes 23 & 24 at Marcin Bowl to establish a career new high triple. His previous high triple was 558 and his high single is 251. Wright is averaging



148 after 28 weeks of bowling this year in the PYL with team members Shaylyn Blake and William Laframboise. Last year in the PYL he averaged 135 for 84 games.

Scott wheels personal high scores:



McKenna Scott rolled 574 (268 - 106 pins over average – 157-149) in the Phantom Youth League (PYL) on lanes 21 & 22 at Marcin Bowl to record a new high triple and single game. Her previous high scores were 565 and 219. McKenna is eligible to receive a watch from the Canadian Tenpin Federation for being 100 pins over average for a single game. She is averaging 162 after 28 weeks of bowling this year with team members Braeden Scott and Cole Sitzes.

David rolls new high three:

Patricia David rolled 552 (207 - 50 pins over average - 167-178) in the Bar10 Thursday Night Mixed League (B10TNML) on lanes 19 & 20 at Marcin Bowl to post her career new high triple. Her previous high triple was 532 and her highest single game is 213. Patricia started bowling 5pin at age 10 in the old SMAA youth bowling organization at the encouragement of her parents. She switched to 10 pin in her early 20's and has been bowling ever since. She is a right handed bowler throwing a straight ball. David's other sporting interests are golf and watching her 9 year old grandson in his various sporting and academic endeavors. Patricia is averaging 157 after 30 weeks in the B10TNML this year bowling with team members Michelle Fraser, Robert Moen,



Scott Savage and Kevin Ptolemy. Last year she averaged 147 for 78 games in the league.

Legault tops his high triple:



Noah Legault wheeled 547 (170- 202 – 55 pins over average – 175) in the Phantom Youth League (PYL) on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl to post his new high triple. His previous high triple was 541 and his career high single is 212. Noah is averaging 147 after 28 weeks in the PYL this year bowling with team members Jack Needham, Lennox Dean and Rio Grasser. Last year in the PYL he averaged 142 for 69 games.

Williams posts new high game:



Dan Williams rolled 241 in his second game of the night to record a new high single beating his previous 226. He was bowling in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) on lanes 29 & 30 at Marcin Bowl finishing the night with a 596 triple. Williams is averaging 169 for 84 games in the MFFL this year bowling with team members Marie Devost, Char, Carrie Thompson and Aaron Johnson. Last year in the MFFL he averaged 158 for 96 games.

Ingles hurls new high single:

Zachary Ingles hurled 232 (80 pins over average) in his second game of the day to record his new personal high single beating his previous 229. He was bowling in the Phantom Youth League (PYL) on lanes 13 & 14 at Marcin Bowl finishing the day with a 533 triple. His career high



triple is 595. Zachary started bowling at age five in 2013 in the Hi-Way Bowl Phantom Youth Bowling Program in the Bumpers Division. He is in his 11th year of bowling. Zachary is averaging 152 after 28 weeks in the PYL bowling with team members Jack Allan and Logan Hannah. Last year in the PYL he averaged 145 for 84 games.

Bacon wheels new high single:



Alexis Bacon wheeled 166 (53 pins over average) in her first game of the day to register her new personal high single topping her previous 156. She was bowling in the Phantom Youth League (PYL) on lanes 15 & 16 at Marcin Bowl finishing the day with a 447 triple which tied her high triple. Alex is averaging 113 after 28 weeks in the PYL bowling with team members Jaxon Hillman-Frank and Brayden Steadman. Last year in the PYL she averaged 82 for 95 games.

Chipman dropped to second:



Shane Chipman fired 762 (257 – 52 pins over average – 246 – 259 – 54 pins over average – 147 pins over average for three games) in the Best Wiring Classic League (BWCL) on lanes 31 & 32 at Marcin Bowl to register the second high triple in LCTA bowling competition this past week. He also tossed 729 (225-268 – 62 pins over average – 236) in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) on lanes 31 & 32 at Marcin Bowl to post the 6th high triple of the week. They were his 6th and 7th 700's in the LCTA this year as he previously rolled 787-708-726-772-730.



Chipman is averaging 207 for 81 games in the BWCL and 206 for 63 games in the MFFL this year.

Adamson rolls strong triple:



Kyle Adamson rolled 751 (259 – 60 pins over average – 256 – 57 pins over average - 236 – 154 pins over average for three games) in the Best Wiring Classic League (BWCL) on lanes 35 & 36 at Marcin Bowl in a two team make up week to register the 3rd high triple of the week in LCTA bowling action. It was his 7th 700 in the LCTA this year as he previously rolled 701-707- 700-781-742-709. Adamson is averaging 199 for 87 games in the BWCL this year.

Lapointe keeps adding to his total:

Ben Lapointe wheeled 748 (252-266-230) in the Best Wiring Classic League (BWCL) on lanes 25 & 26 at Marcin Bowl to post the 4th high triple of the week in LCTA bowling activity. He also tossed 723 (277 – 61 pins over average – 226-220) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men’s League (FTBMNML) on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl to record the 7th high triple of the week. They were his 32nd and 33rd 700’s in the LCTA this season and his career 112th and 113th 700’s in the LCTA. Lapointe is holding the high average in the BWCL this year averaging 223 for 60 games. In the FTBMNML he is averaging 217 for 81 games.



Parkkila notches another 700:

Kole Parkkila did not have a 700 before this bowling season started. He now has three as he fired 737 (233-259 – 64 pins over average – 245 – 158 pins over average for three games) in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) on lanes 19 & 20 at Marcin Bowl to record the 5th high triple of the week in LCTA bowling action. His previous 2-700's were 720 (236-259-225) and 701 (199-257-245). He also has one of the nine 300's posted in the LCTA this season. Parkkila is averaging 195 for 81 games in the MFFL this year.

Legault has solid night:

Pat Legault tossed 721 (240-244-237) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (FTBMNML) on lanes 25 & 26 at Marcin Bowl to post the 8th high triple of the week in LCTA bowling competition. It was his 6th 700 in the LCTA this season as he previously rolled 717-725-738-729-723. Legault is averaging 216 for 75 games in the FTBMNML this year. English good for ninth position:

Peter English wheeled 719 (225-246-248) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (FTBMNML) on lanes 29 & 30 at Marcin Bowl to take 9th place in the high triple department this past week in LCTA bowling action. It was his 2nd 700 this season in the LCTA as he previously bowled 700 (222-213-265). English is averaging

Creasor takes tenth spot:



Jim Creasor bowled 706 (237-222-247) in the Best Wiring Classic League (BWCL) on lanes 35 & 36 at Marcin Bowl to register the 10th high triple of the week in LCTA bowling play. It was his 2nd 700 in the LCTA this season as he previously bowled 749 (277-234-238). Creasor is averaging 211 for 24 games as a spare in the BWCL this year.

Lapointe Senior grabs last spot:

Jim Lapointe hurled 705 (237-214-254) in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) on lanes 35 & 36 at Marcin Bowl to grab last spot in the 700 race this past week in the LCTA. It was his 15th 700 in the LCTA this season. Lapointe is averaging 238 for 15 games as a spare in the MFFL this year. Jim is also averaging 216 for 78 games in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League, 220 for 78 games in the Best Wiring Classic League and 223 for 15 games in the Sarnia Produce Border City Men's League this year.

Memory Lane:

Scott was born to bowl

His average has fallen slightly over the years, but Al Scott can still throw a strike when it counts.

Scott, of Wyoming, recently finished third over all in Class 'B' at the 2005 U.S. National Seniors Championships in Reno Nevada.

It was his first trip to the annual event sponsored by the United States Bowling Congress.

To advance to the Nevada competition, Scott won the Class 'B' seniors Canadian Ten Pin Federation championships held last fall in St. Catharines.

Class 'B' is open to senior bowlers between 65 and 70 years of age.

Asked how long he'd been bowling for, Scott replied "too long."

Scott actually recalls getting started in bowling back "about the late 1950s or early 1960s" when he worked for the post office as a letter carrier and clerk.

"I used to bowl at the old National (Lanes) downtown," Scott said.

The National was located on Christina Street, across from the Imperial Theatre, and upstairs of a billiards hall.

Now 66, Scott said he continues to play the game out of pure "enjoyment and companionship."

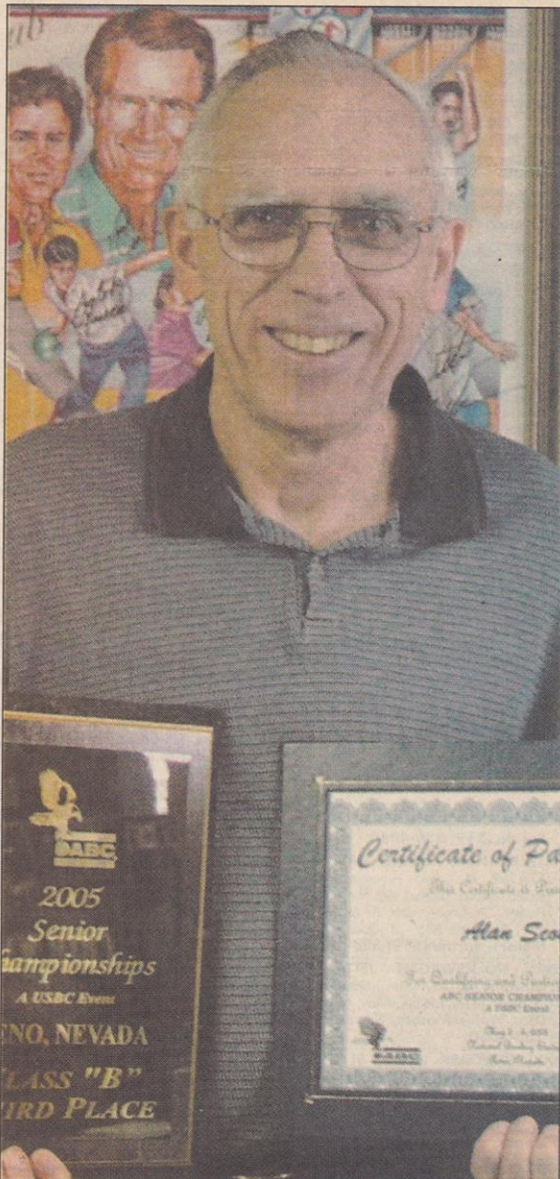
"The perfect game," added his wife Mary. "He's never had one."

Scott says the closest he's come to a perfect game was rolling a 276 "many years ago." His high triple was a 735.

"I'm not a big shooter," he said. "I'm in the middle."

Scott, who retired from Dow Chemical in 1994 after 31 years working as a millwright, says his current average playing in the Marcin Bowl Thursday night house league hovers around 181 pins. That's down from a high of about 196 pins he held in the mid-1960s.

Scott's third place finish in Reno, when he bowled games of 202, 189, 225, 192, 215 and 187, was his best finish to date in a major international competition. Bowlers were representing 48 states and three Canadian provinces.

Even at age 66, Al Scott is dominating in 10-pin bowling and still loves the game.

"It's the best I've ever done. It's a singles tournament so you are on your own," Scott said about his result.

"I would have been happy with a top 10. I never expected a top three."

Over the years, Scott has been on several league championship teams and has also qualified to compete in the American Bowling Congress championships on at least a dozen different occasions.
