Weekly Highlights

Parkkila walks off the lanes with 300:



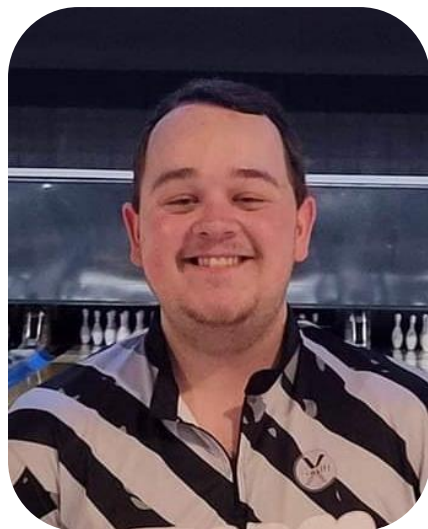
Kole Parkkila is having quite the year in the Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) this season. He has rolled his career first 2-700's - 720 (236-259-225) and 701 (199-257-245) and this past week he recorded his first 300 (108 pins over average) in his first game of the night with all good pocket hits. This writer asked the right handed bowler how he felt standing on the approach for his final ball with loads of eyes watching him. His reply "I was thinking to myself just one more good shot". For all you bowlers that have been in that situation, I'm sure the response sounds very

familiar. Parkkila fired the gem in the Mulder Financial Fun League (MFFL) using his 15 pound "Roto Grip Hustle Ink" bowling ball on lanes 31 & 32 at Marcin Bowl finishing with a 674 triple. It was the 8th 300 in the LCTA this season. Parkkila is eligible to receive a Canadian Tenpin Federation watch for being 100 pins over average if he has not achieved this accomplishment before. Kole started enjoying the great game of 10-pin bowling at age 5 in the Hi-Way Bowl Junior Bowlers



League in the Bumpers Division. Kole is now 19 years old so he has been attacking bowling pins for 14 years even though a couple of those years were 5-pins at Marcin Bowl. This writer watched Parkkila spare in the Sarnia Produce Border City Men's League last week. When his bowling ball touches down on the lane it already has a ton of revs. It just so happens that his cousin "Ben Lapointe" and his older brother "Justin" have the same amount of revs on their bowling balls at that starting point. Kole confirmed that yes indeed they did help him in perfecting the many aspects of his game. Parkkila is averaging 193 for 60 games In the MFFL this year.

Lapointe joins century club:



Ben Lapointe joined the 700 century club, a club that not many amateur bowlers can reach in their life time, by rolling number 100, 101, 102 and 103-700's in the LCTA this past week. They were his 19, 20, 21 and 22 700 triples this season. Lapointe fired 709 (217-258-234) in the Mulder Financial Fun League on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl to reach this milestone. He then fired 751 (238-257-256) in the Best Wiring Classic League on lanes 31 & 32, followed by 728 (242-248-238) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's

League on lanes 17 & 18 and finished the week with 712 (290-207-215) in the Sarnia Produce Border City Men's League on lanes 31 & 32. His triples were good for number 1, 4, 9 and 10 spots in the high triple race this week. This writer wonders how long it will take him to reach 200-700's. The way he is slaughtering the pins he will probably accomplish the job in the next 5-6 years. Lapointe is either bowling full time or sparing in four leagues this year which certainly helps him to get his game in top condition. He also has one big factor on his side – he's only 24 years old. Not taking anything away from Lapointe, he is an extremely talented bowler with a ton of skills on the lanes.



Youth Bowling Tournament in Mississauga:

Seventy-five junior bowlers from the Province of Ontario travelled to Classic Bowl in Mississauga on February 4 to compete in different divisions with an Adult/Parent partner in the Joyce Woolgar Memorial Family Twosome Tournament. Nineteen doubles teams from Lambton County participated in the tournament from the Marcin Bowl Phantom Youth League. The bowlers were competing for scholarship money to be used for future education purposes. \$7,900.00 of scholarship money was there to be won and Lambton County youth bowlers came home with \$2400.00 (30.3% of the purse).



There were 13 entries in the Adult/Teen Girls Division with Alexis Bacon and Tony Olson from Marcin Bowl taking 1st place winning \$500.00 in scholarship funds. Alexis entered the tournament with a 108 average and tossed games of 131-121-136-95. Tony entered the tournament with a 176 average and rolled games of 159-215-267-202. Their combined scratch total was 1326 and with their 784

handicap they finished with 2110 to win their division.

There were 31 entries in the Adult/Teen Boys Division with the team of Daniel Wright and Kim Grasser from Marcin Bowl taking 4th spot winning \$350.00 in scholarship funds. Daniel entered the tournament with a 142 average and hurled games of 161-174-251-149. Kim entered the tournament with a 112

average and rolled games of 139-115-102-125. Their combined scratch total was 1116 and with their 1004 handicap they finished with 2120.



There were 10 entries in the Adult/Youth Girls Division with the team of Lily Beveridge and Alexandra Beveridge from Marcin Bowl coming in 2nd place winning \$450.00 in scholarship funds. Lily entered the tournament with a 95 average and tossed games of 109-108-143-106. Alexandra entered the tournament with a 153 average and bowled games

of 187-164-137-156. Their combined scratch total was 1110 and with their 928 handicap they finished with 2038.

In the same division, the team of Peyton Fraser and Ian Fraser from Marcin Bowl came in 3rd place winning \$400.00 in scholarship funds. Peyton entered the tournament with a 37 average and wheeled games of 38-31-28-54. Ian entered the tournament with a 192 average and rolled games of 190-255-203-201. Their combined scratch total was 1000 and with their 1004 handicap they finished with 2004.





There were 21 entries In the Adult/Youth Boys Division with the team of Rio Grasser and Dave Grasser coming in 3rd place winning \$400.00 in scholarship funds. Rio entered the tournament with a 106 average and wheeled games of 147-114-87-100. Dave entered the tournament with a 129 average and tossed games of 181-155-153-111. Their combined scratch total was 1048 and with their 980 handicap they finished with 2028.

In the same division, the team of Noah Legault and Ben Lapointe came in 5th place winning \$300.00 in scholarship funds. Noah entered the tournament with a 152 average and bowled games of 156-173-179-154. Ben entered the tournament with 219 average and fired games of 217-256-201-220. Their combined scratch total was 1556 and with their 436 handicap they finished with 1992.

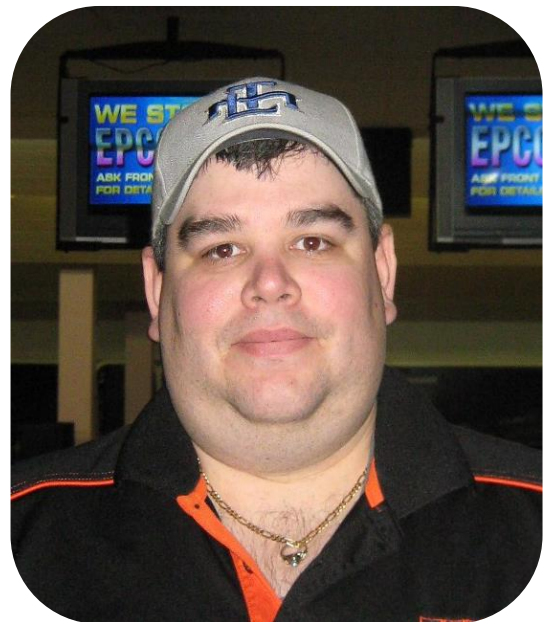

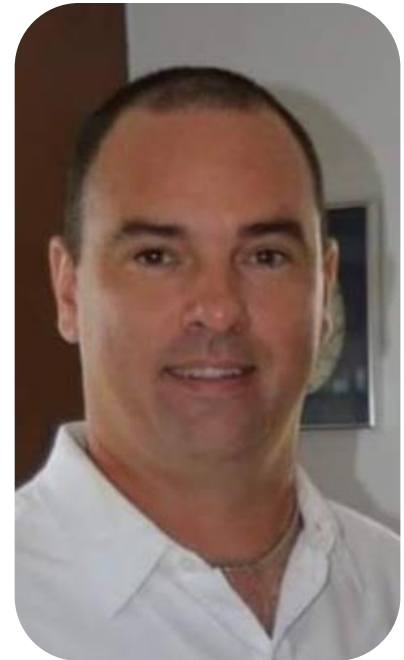
Lapointe keeps streak alive:

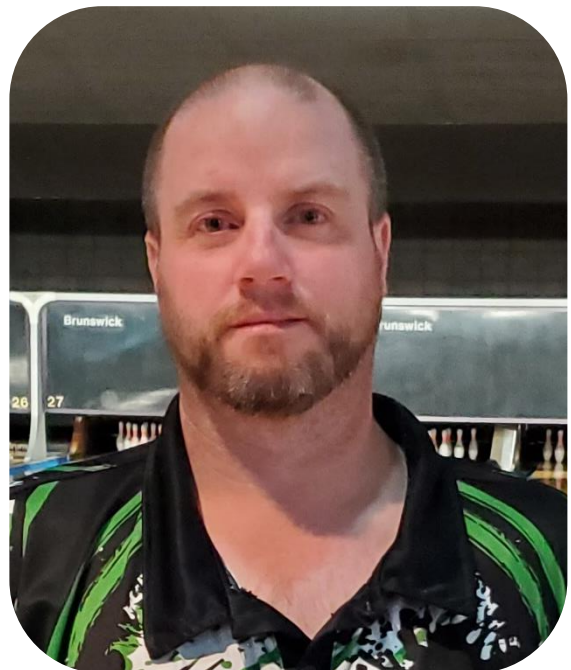


Lewicki is second last:
