Weekly Highlights

Plumb is week's high bowler:



Larry Plumb hurled 726 (254-215-257) on lanes 3 & 4 in the Sunday Morning Classic League (SMCL) at Hi-Way Bowl to record the high triple of the week in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling competition. Plumb is averaging 219 for 81 games in the SMCL this season. He is chasing Mike

Shephard 224 (81 games) and Steve Lewicki 220 (81 games) for the high average in the league. Below Plumb is Ben Lapointe 218 (75 games) and Jim Lapointe 217 (81 games).



Adamson nipped to second best:

Kyle Adamson fired 725 (239-221-265 – 68 pins over average – 134 pins over average for three games) to take second place in the high triple department this week in LCTA bowling action. He was bonding with the boys on lanes 7 & 8 in the Sunday Morning Classic League (SMCL). Adamson is averaging 199 for 78 games in the SMCL. Kyle is also bowling in the Border City Men's League this year averaging 197 for 66 games. He has 17 Honour Scores to his credit – 800's (6) – 300's (7) – 299 (1) and 298's (3).

Parkkila rolls personal high scores:

Kole Parkkila rolled 669 (263 – 80 pins over average - 187-219) in the RCAFA 403 Wing Mixed League at Hi-Way Bowl to record his personal highest triple and single game. His previous high triple was 648 and his previous high single game was 255. Kole is averaging 183 for 60 games in the RCAFA league this year.

Hannah is youth high over average:

Logan Hannah wheeled 233 -80 pins over average in his final game of the day to register the youth high over average for a single game in LCTA bowling action this past week. He was bowling in the Intermediate

Division in the Phantom Youth Bowling Program at Hi-Way Bowl. Hannah is averaging 153 for 63 games this year. Last year in a Covid shortened season he averaged 135 for 27 games in the Junior Division.

Youth bowler second high over average:

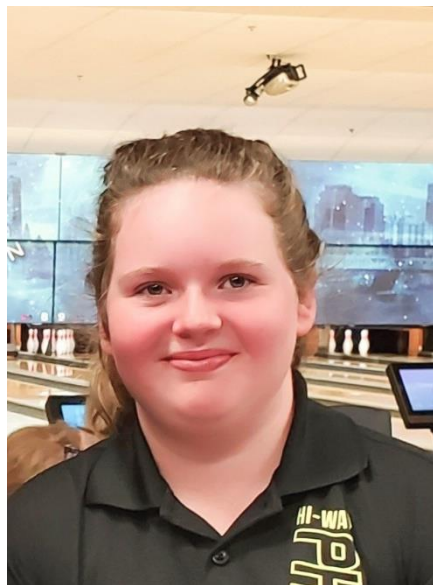
Tyler George fired 155 – 75 pins over average in his first game of the day to post the youth's second high over average for a single game in LCTA bowling activity this past week. He was taking part in the Preps Division of the Phantom Youth Bowling Program at Hi-Way Bowl. Tyler is averaging 80 for 48 games this year. Last year in a Covid shortened season he finished with an 84 average for 36 games.

Youth bowlers earn scholarship funds:

On Sunday, April 10th, 19 Youth Bowlers from Lambton County bowled in the Ontario Youth Singles Tournament at Fleetway Lanes (first time ever at that bowling house) held under the London & District Tenpin Bowling Association. There was a total of 58 Bowlers taking part in the competition. This sanctioned



Tournament was set up differently than what our youth are familiar with in that there were 6 Divisions (3 Boys and 3 Girls) based on an average range instead of age division and Lambton County Youth came out shining AGAIN. A total scholarship fund of \$1855 was paid out and our Lambton Youth brought back \$480 (25%) of the total available funds. These scholarship funds will be used to further their education in the future. Successful Lambton County bowlers earning scholarship funds were Karys Nesbitt, Collin Gray, Zackery Visser, Shaylyn Blake and Caleb Bell. The LCTA congratulates these bowlers for their success on the lanes.



In the Girls Division C (average up to 119), a total of 15 girls were entered and Karys Nesbitt placed 1st and received \$150 in scholarship money. She also bowled her personal highest game 157 and personal highest triple 406 in her victory. Karys started bowling in the Hi-Way Bowl Phantom Junior Bowling Program at age 9 and she has been enjoying the Saturday morning fun for 4

years now. She said she really enjoys bowling with her sister and her two other team mates. Karys got interested in bowling when her dad signed her up and she really liked the bowling and the Saturday morning friendship. Karys said a memorable happy moment in bowling for her was when she rolled her first game over



100 (107). She is currently averaging 103 for 60 games this season. Her other sporting interest is soccer.



In the Boys Division C (average up to 119) a total of 23 boys were entered and Collin Gray ended up in 2nd Place earning \$125 in scholarship money. He also bowled his personal highest game (115) in the tournament. This was the second time this season that Collin was successful in winning scholarship money. He and

Johnny Wilkinson (step father) finished in third place in the 12 and under Boys Division winning \$300.00 of scholarship money in the Junior Bowler/Parent Family Twosome Tournament held at Classic Bowl in Mississauga. Collin was 8 years old when he started bowling in the Phantom Junior Bowling Program (PJPB) at Hi-Way Bowl. He originally got interested in bowling at age 6 when his mom used to take him and his sister 5-pin bowling all the time. Two years later he switched to 10-pin, joined the PJPB and the rest is history. His highest triple is 291. His other interests besides school are baseball and video games.

In Boys Division C (average up to 119) Zackery Visser placed 3rd earning \$100 in scholarship money. Zackery is a late starter in 10-pin bowling as he joined the



Hi-Way Bowl Phantom Junior Bowling Program this year at age 20 because a friend of his encouraged him to get involved in bowling. His highest triple is 443 and his highest single game is 168. He is averaging 111 for 60 games in his first year of organized bowling. His other interests are playing golf, pool, video games and Dnd (A roll playing game with dice called dungeons and dragons).



In the Girls Division C (average up to 119), Shaylyn Blake ended up in 4th place winning \$75 in scholarship money. Shaylyn started organized league bowling in the Phantom Junior Bowling Program (PJPB) at Hi-Way Bowl at age 4 and has been enjoying the Saturday morning friendship on the lanes for 11 years. She comes from a bowling family so it was only natural for her to follow their

footsteps. Her highest single game is 198 but she could not recall the score of her highest triple. She is averaging 113 for 66 games in the PJPB this season. She said her most memorable moment in bowling was when she and Shirley Matthews won the 2015 Youth/Family/Adult Twosome Tournament winning an Ontario Tenpin Bowling Association scholarship worth \$705.00. Besides keeping herself busy with school and bowling she enjoys baseball and dancing.





In the Boys Division C (average up to 119) Caleb Bell took 6th place earning \$30 scholarship money. Caleb started organized bowling in the Marcin Bowl Youth Bowling Program in 2016 at age 10 and in 2019 switched to the Phantom Junior Bowling Program (PJBP) at Hi-Way

Bowl and has been knocking down the pins for 6 years. He enjoyed recreational bowling with his family so his mother thought he would be interested in joining organized league bowling. His highest triple is 415 and his highest single game is 170 which he bowled in the Youth Singles Tournament in London a few weeks ago. He is averaging 114 for 66 games in the PJBP this season. Caleb enjoys watching sports and has been a volunteer with the Special Olympics Sarnia helping with bowling, basketball, soccer, bocce and track and field. Besides keeping himself busy with school and bowling, he plays the guitar and enjoys working on old cars with his dad. They are currently working on a Ford Mustang drag car. He would like to thank his coaches Shirley and Mel Matthews for helping him with his game and his fellow bowlers for their friendship.

The next and final Youth Tournament is coming up at Classic Bowl in Mississauga on May 7-8 where 4 Lambton County teams will be attending to compete in the Team, Doubles, Singles and All Events.
