



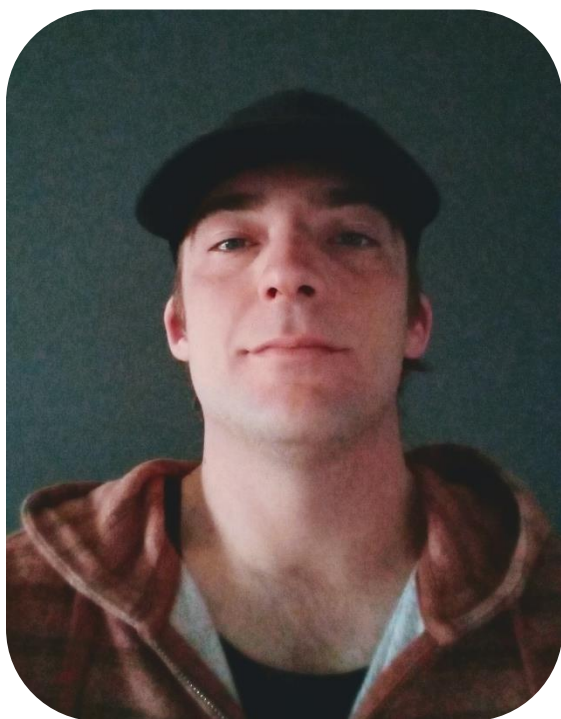

Weekly Highlights

Kinny fires first 300:



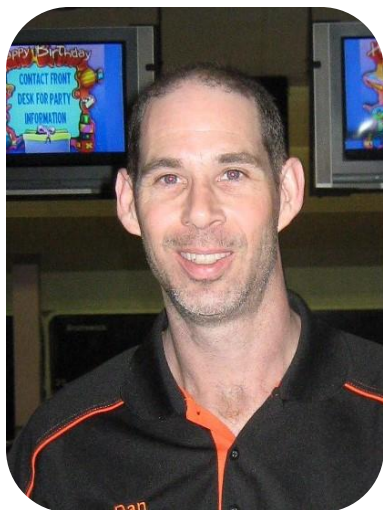
TJ Kinny will always remember the excitement of last Friday night when he fired his career first perfect game in his last game of the evening in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling action. He was bowling in the Friday Night Fun Mixed League (FNFML) on lanes 23 & 24 at Marcin Bowl finishing the night with 645 (176-169-300 – 97 pins over average). It was the 10th perfect game recorded in the LCTA this year. The other nine bowlers

can be found under “Honour Scores” on the LCTA web site. Kinny started bowling around age 5 going straight through the Hi-Way Bowl Youth Bowling Program until age 21. His personal high single was 279 and his high triple is an even 800 triple which he rolled as a Hi-Way



Bowl Junior at age 19 on October 2, 2002. Kinny is averaging 203 after 25 weeks in the FNFML.

Chopp second best with 299:



Dan Chopp rolled the first eleven strikes in his last game of the night. All were good pocket hits except the 6th frame where he came a little high on the head pin but carried the strike. On his last delivery he also came a bit high on the head pin leaving the 4-pin. It was the 4th 299 in the LCTA this season and the 2nd for Chopp. The other two were by Kyle Adamson and Pete Dufault. When talking to Chopp he said he changed balls for his last game because the other one he was using was not working to his liking. Chopp was bowling in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) finishing the night with a 706 (202-205-299 - 78 pins over average) triple. His triple was good for the 7th high triple of the week. It was also his 9th 700 series this season. Chopper is averaging 228 for 18 games as a spare in the BMNML this year.

Koundakjian rolls career high scores:

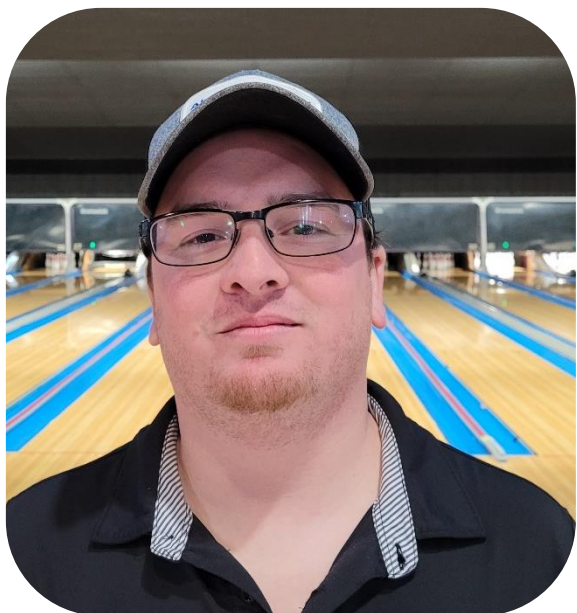
Werner Koundakjian rolled 243 (84 pins over average) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) on lanes 23 & 24 at Marcin Bowl in his first game to post his career high single and his highest

triple 559 . Werner started bowling at age 39 and has been bowling for 13 years. He comes from a bowling family as his wife and daughters also enjoyed the fun on the lanes and Werner bowled with his daughters in the Provincial Family Twosome Tournaments. Koundakjian started sanctioned league bowling in the 2018-2019 bowling season in the BMNML. His other interests are hockey, basketball and football. As a hobby he loves playing pool and wood working. He is a right handed bowler averaging 160 for 69 games in the league. Koundakjian bowls on the team “Bomb Squad” with team members Gilles Laprise, Paul Eddleston and Warren Knights.

Finley posts career high triple:



Will Finley wheeled 625 (212-182-231 – 68 pins over average – 136 pins over average for three games) in the Border City Men’s League (BCML) on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl to post his career high triple. Finley started sanctioned league bowling in the 2019-2020 bowling season in the Thursday Night Men’s League at Marcin Bowl finishing with a 148

average for 45 games. This year he is averaging 166 for 60 games in the BCML. Finley bowls on the team “Gutter Gang” with Connor A Smith, Kris Mandeville, Dylon McKinnon and Owen Allison.



Lewicki leads the way:

Lefty Steve Lewicki fired 774 (288 – 68 pins over average – 269 – 49 pins over average – 217) in the Sunday Morning Classic League (SMCL) on lanes 21 & 22 at Marcin Bowl to record the top triple in LCTA bowling competition this past week. It was his 6th 700 this year as he previously rolled 733 – 722 – 743 – 708 and 711. Lewicki has been struggling on

the lanes the last few months and did not have a 700 triple in the LCTA since November of last year. He just purchased a new STORM IQ TOUR RUBY balling ball and the result was explosive. Perhaps this writer should do the same to pick up his game. Lewicki is averaging 222 for 60 games in SMCL. He is followed by the next three bowlers with their averages and games in brackets: Mike Marciniszyn 218 (75), Larry Plumb 216 (75) and Dan Chopp 216 (39).

Pimentel is high over average:

Dan Pimentel tossed 616 (210-201-205 – 184 pins over average for three games) in the Friday Night Fun Mixed League (FNFML) on lanes 17 & 18 at Marcin Bowl to take the honours for the highest over average for three games in LCTA bowling action this past week. This writer was unable to confirm but guesses this is Dan's career highest triple. If someone can confirm this please let me know. Pimentel is averaging 146 after 25 weeks in the FNFML. He bowls on the team



consisting of Patti Wyville, Cori Landon, Dave Slater and Fabio Caporale.

Atchison adds to his total:



Nathan Atchison rolled 739 (267 – 55 pins over average – 246- 226) in the Friday Night Fun Mixed League (FNFML) on lanes 21 & 22 at Marcin Bowl to record the 2nd high triple of the week in LCTA bowling activity. It was his 6th 700 this year as he previously tossed 709-702-711-702 and 736. He is averaging 212 after 25 weeks in the FNFML. Atchison's has a career sanctioned 2-800's (824 – 811) and 3-300's to his credit.

English reaches year's 700 club:



Peter English wheeled 735 (220-257 – 65 pins over average – 258 – 66 pins over average – 159 pins over average for three games) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) on lanes 15 & 16 at Marcin Bowl to record his first 700 series this season and the 3rd high triple of the week. English started bowling at age 13 coming up through the SOMOCO (Sombra-

Mooretown-Courtright) Youth Bowling Organization at Airey Lanes in Courtright. Peter played organized hockey in his younger days but now he volunteers for the Sarnia Legionnaires and watches all sports



in general. His hobby is making metal signs. One of his most memorable moments in bowling, besides bowling his first perfect game, was when the team of Darrell Dennett, Jim Wolfgram, Doug Brooks and Peter English won the Men's Handicap Division in the Ontario Tenpin Provincial Tournament held in Kitchener in 1997. They were the first ever Sarnia team to win the team tournament. English, a right handed bowler, has career high scores of 751 and 300 (4). He is averaging 194 for 75 games in the BMNML this year.

Adamson takes fourth position:



Kyle Adamson tossed 723 (228-233-262 – 56 pins over average) in the Sunday Morning Classic League (SMCL) on lanes 15 & 16 at Marcin Bowl to register the 4th high triple of the week in LCTA bowling action. It was his 7th 700 this year as he previously wheeled 736 – 733 – 706 – 738 – 709 and 731. Adamson started the season in a slow pace but has been

gaining momentum over the last several months. He is averaging 207 for 69 games in the SMCL this year.

Raymond grabs fifth spot:

Jeff Raymond bowled 716 (248-254-214) in the Sunday Morning Classic League (SMCL) on lanes



19 & 20 at Marcin Bowl to grab the 5th spot in the 700 race this week in LCTA bowling play. It was his 3rd 700 this season. Jeff is averaging 209 for 72 games in the SMCL. His career high scores are 775 and 300 (3). Raymond bowls on a team with Mike Marciniszyn and Alex Salmons and their team is holding down first place in the league.

Core and Mezzatesta tie for sixth:



Brian Core tossed 714 (265 – 77 pins over average – 239 – 210 – 150 pins over average for three games) in the Friday Night Fun Mixed League (FNFML) on lanes 25 & 26 at Marcin Bowl to take the 6th high triple spot in LCTA bowling play this week. It was his first 700 this season. Core is averaging 190 after 25 weeks in the FNFML. His career high scores are 716 and 265.

Roy Mezzatesta bowled 714 (224-247-243) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) on lanes 19 & 20 at Marcin Bowl to tie for the 6th high triple of the week. It was Mezzatesta's 10th 700 series this season tying him with John Armstrong one behind the leaders Mike Shephard and Ben Lapointe with 11 each. Roy is averaging 209 for 69 games in the BMNML this year.



Ridealgh good for eighth position:

Bill Ridealgh fired 705 (203-255-247) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League on lanes 31 & 32 at Marcin Bowl to take 8th place in the high triple department this week in LCTA bowling competition. It was his 3rd 700 this season. Ridealgh is averaging 215 for 18 games in the BMNML this season. He also bowls in the Sunday Morning Classic League and is averaging 201 for 48 games. His career high scores are 775 and 300 (2).

Lapointe rolls into tie for first place:

Ben Lapointe rolled 702 (205-264 – 56 pins over average – 233) in the Border City Men's League on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl to take the 9th position in the 700 race this week in LCTA bowling action. It was his career 75th 700 series (59 in adult leagues and 16 in past youth leagues). It was also his 11th 700 series this season tying him with Mike Shephard for the highest number of 700's this season.



Plumb at bottom of 700 list:

Larry Plumb hurled 701 (228-230-243) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) on lanes 31 and 32 at Marcin Bowl to hold down last spot in the 700 division this week in LCTA bowling activity. It was plumb's 8th 700 series this year. Larry is averaging 222 for 42 games in the BMNML this year. He also bowls in the Sunday Morning Classic League

and is averaging 216 for 75 games.

Legault is ladies top bowler:

Karyne Legault rolled 677 (193 – 266 – 68 pins over average – 218) in the Sunday Morning Classic League on lanes 23 & 24 at Marcin Bowl to record the ladies top triple of the week in LCTA play. She is averaging 207 for 9 games as a spare in the league.

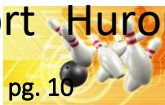
Marciniszyn is ladies second best:

Pam Marciniszyn tossed 676 (257-235) in the Thursday Night Mixed League (TNML) on lanes 13 & 14 at Marcin Bowl to register the ladies second high triple of the week. Marciniszyn bowls once a week and is averaging 208 after 78 games in the league. Last week she had a super week in the TNML firing 771 (300-237-234).

Brander is featured bowler:

Kaye Brander is the LCTA featured bowler of the week. Kaye did not come up through a youth bowling organization but started 10-pin bowling at age 21 in September 1969. Over the years she had bowled at Hi-Way Bowl, Marcin Bowl, Airey Lanes in Courtright, Lake Huron Bowl and Bluewater Bowl in Port Huron. Her mother "Lillian Brown" got her interested in bowling when she invited Kaye to bowl in her afternoon league. Her mother was already a long time bowler and held a position on the

Port Huron Women's Bowling Association (PHWBA) under the



Women's International Bowling Congress (WIBC) in the USA. At that time, the Sarnia women belonged to the PHWBA and the Sarnia men belonged to the Sarnia & District Tenpin Bowling Association under the American Bowling Congress. Brander said her mother convinced her to be on the WIBC board and she served for 11 years. When the USA/Canada bowling association split in the 2003-2004 season to become separate identities, the LCTA interim board was formed and in the 2004-2005 season the LCTA became official. The Sarnia men and women now belonged to the LCTA under the Canadian Tenpin Federation. Kaye was a board member on the interim board and then on the LCTA for several years. She also served as secretary/treasurer on a couple of Sarnia leagues. When she was a board member of WIBC she attended quite a few National Tournaments and Conventions, all the State Tournaments and the City Tournaments every year since her 2nd year of bowling. She also enjoyed a couple Peterson Tournaments, in Chicago, winning high game on a certain lane once. She started out as a 120 average bowler, and eventually made it up to 179 for a year or two.

Brander said she didn't participate in other sports but encouraged and attended her son's hockey and baseball games in Courtright and Petrolia. Over the years she has been following the Toronto Blue Jays and Toronto Maple Leafs even during all their bad years. She also likes to watch and follow on line Formula One which is currently the highest class of open-wheeled auto racing in Europe.

Kaye's other interests include quilting, knitting, cross-stitching (the oldest art form of embroidery dating back to the Middle Ages),



sewing and jigsaw puzzles. She noted that she knits mostly for charity these days although her boys would tell you they never owned a store bought hat, mitts, or sweater their entire childhood. When her husband became ill she started doing Jigsaw puzzles and since 2016 she has completed 450 puzzles mostly 1000 pieces each. When the puzzles are done, she passes them around to friends before donating them to the hospital, senior homes or anyone that might want them. She also did stained glass for about 5 years including the 2 sky lights currently in her home and the angels and other pictures in her windows. Many of her pieces became wedding, birthday and anniversary gifts.

Brander is a right handed bowler using a 12 pound ball with a career high triple of 687 which she posted at Bluewater Bowl in Port Huron and her highest single is 286 bowled at her very first State Tournament. Kaye said” They used to give out a jacket for a 600 in Port Huron (I owned quite a few....different Colours each year). Then, *because there were so many, they started raising the bar. That year they said 685 was the newest limit, so I bowled my 687 on the last day of the season, only to learn they were not doing ANY jackets that year.*” At 75 she is currently bowling in two fun leagues at Marcin Bowl and the sanctioned Target Trios League at Hi-Way Bowl. She hopes to bowl for many more years because as she said “you do meet a lot of very nice people”.

Brander has three rules for bowling: 1) Keep it on the shiny part. 2) Throw your second ball first, especially if you messed up rule 1 and 3) **HAVE FUN** no matter how poorly you do. In closing she said
