Weekly Highlights

Ridealgh is week's top bowler:



Bill Ridealgh hurled 743 (226-269 – 61 pins over average – 248 – 40 pins over average – 119 pins over average for three games) in the Fabbri Tile Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (FTBMNML) on lanes 29 & 30 at Marcin Bowl, to post the high triple of the week in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling competition. It was his 8th 700 triple of the season. Ridealgh is averaging 210 for 69 games in the FTBMNML this season.

McKinnon fires new high triple:



Dylon McKinnon fired 616 (229 – 56 pins over average – 197-190) in the Sarnia Produce Border City Men's League (SPBCML) on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl to record a new personal high triple. His previous high triple was 609 (246-160-203) and his career high single is 246 both rolled in the SPBCML last season. McKinnon is now averaging 174 for 54 games. Last year in the league he averaged 171 for 57 games.



Armstrong good for second position:



John Armstrong wheeled 717 (266 - 66 pins over average – 259 – 59 pins over average – 192 - 117 pins over average for three games) as a spare in the Sarnia Produce Border City Men’s League (SPBCML) on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl, to take second place in the high triple department this past week. It was his 7th 700 this season in the LCTA. Armstrong is now averaging 220 for 9 games in the SPBCML this season.

Smith and Lapointe share the low 700 triple:

Ben Lapointe and lefty Jay Smith shared the low 700 triple of the week in LCTA bowling activity.



Lapointe rolled 706 (228-224-254) in the Best Wiring Classic League (BWCL) on lanes 29 & 30 at Marcin Bowl. It was his 25th 700 of the season and his career 139th 700. Lapointe sneaks ahead of Mike Shephard who has 24-700’s this season in the race for the season’s 700 crown, as Mike has been struggling on the lanes lately. Lapointe is leading the BWCL with a 228 average for 69 games followed by Mike Marciniszyn with 222 (72 games), Jamie Ridealgh 221 (45 games) and Jim Lapointe 220 (72 games).



Smith tossed 706 (257 – 56 pins over average – 247 – 46 pins over average -202) in the Sarnia Produce Border City Men’s League (SPBCML) on lanes 27 & 28 at Marcin Bowl. It was his 3rd 700 in the LCTA this season as he previously bowled 752 (238-236-278) and 703 (279-223-201). Smith is now averaging 203 for 69 games in the SPBCML this year.



Shura leads the youth again:



Joshua Shura fired 646 (225-214-207) in the Phantom Youth League (PYL) on lanes 13 & 14 at Marcin Bowl to register the youth high triple of the week in the LCTA. It was the third consecutive week that Shura posted the youth high triple as he previously bowled 665 (243-190-232) and 642 (190-189-263). Joshua is averaging 187 after 24 weeks on the lanes in the PYL this year.

Youth bowler records new high single:

Maxx Langford wheeled 166 (63 pins over average) in his second game of the day to record a personal new high single topping his previous 159. He was bowling in the Phantom Youth League at Marcin Bowl finishing the day with a 402 triple. Maxx is averaging 103 after 24 weeks in the league.

Strangway leads the way for the women:



Anne Strangway bowled 614 (221 – 45 pins over average – 215-178) in the Bar 10 Thursday Night Mixed League (B10TNML) on lanes 15 & 16 at Marcin Bowl to record the women’s high triple of the week in LCTA bowling action. Anne is averaging 177 after 25 weeks on the lanes. Last year in the league she averaged 162 for 93 games. Here career high scores are 664 and 269. She also has bowled 662 (186-218-258) in the B10TNML this season.

Kelly Sitter tossed 605 (234-166-205) in the RCAFA 403 Wing Mixed League at Marcin Bowl to register the ladies second high triple of the week in the LCTA. Sarnia-Lambton Hall of Fame

Sport legends selected

Former Sarnia sporting legends who will be inducted into the Sarnia Lambton Sports Hall of Fame were announced this week.

Those selected were pre 1950 athletes Alex Hayes, Roy Kent and Stewie Phillips, post 1950 athletes Jack LeClair and Barry Howson, builder Clarence Cranston and teams 1938 Junior Imperials and 1966 Drawbridge Inn Knights basketball team. Special awards will be presented to Roy Caley and Tom Norris while Hall of Fame Old Timers Awards will go to Frank Burwell, Jennings Scheafer and Jackie Baker.

The annual induction dinner will be held Saturday, October 8 at the Canterbury Hotel. Tickets are \$20 per person and available from any Hall of Fame member including Ted Wood at City Hall or Rose Hodgson at Andy Brandt's office.

The following is a brief summation of each inductee.

ALEX HAYES

A Sarnia native born in 1910, he served as quarterback for the Sarnia Imperials from 1931 to 1938 when the club won eight senior ORFU titles including the 1934 and 1936 Grey Cup teams. He captained the team for five years and was chosen on four ORFU all-star teams and was on the second team from the all-Canadian in 1934. He was twice voted the all Canadian quarterback. An active curler, he was on a rink from Sarnia that won the 1936 Tankard and later skipped the rink which won the 1939 Ontario Bonspeil.

ROY KENT

One of the top athletes at SCITS for his time he was named their top athlete in 1934-35. There he was a four time

school boxing and wrestling champion and later went on to the University of Western Ontario where he won the Intercollegiate boxing championship. He served on SCITS' gymnastics team for four years. He was also an active football player serving with SCITS on the Ontario high school championship team. He later played with Western and Sarnia Wanderers which won the intermediate ORFU title. He was inducted into Western's athletic Hall of Fame in 1986.

STEWIE PHILLIPS

Born in Saskatchewan in 1912 he played football with Cedeims and Intermediate Wanderers in Sarnia. He played baseball with the junior Cedeims and senior Sarnia Red Sox. The Red Sox won the OBA title in 1934. From 1935 until 1950 he played, coached and refereed lacrosse in Sarnia. He also played nine years of hockey with Junior Cedeims and Senior Panthers.

BARRY HOWSON

A London native, he attended high school and university there where he was an all-star team member. Sir Adam Beck High School won an OF-SAA title with Howson. He moved to Sarnia in 1962 and played on Ontario senior basketball championships in

1966 and 1968 with Drawbridge Inn Knights. He played on two Ontario champions with London Celtics in 1972 and London Rent a Car in 1973. He captained the 1964 Canada Olympic team and served in several other world events. He was also active in baseball and track-and-field, the latter where he won an OFSAA gold medal. A teacher at St. Pat's for the past 24 years, he is an active boys basketball coach and also coached track and football. He is still an active player in the Sarnia Mens Basketball League.

JACK LECLAIR

An excellent ten-pin bowler, he was bowling in the American Bowling Congress tournaments in Detroit and Syracuse with an average of 180s. He had Sarnia's high average for eight consecutive years and represented Sarnia six times in Ontario singles tournaments placing second and seventh. He won a Sarnia and Port Huron title in the same year. He won the Labatts singles title in 1954 and was a member of Dayton Plumbing which won the Labatts title.

CLARENCE CRANSTON

One of the 10 founders of the SMAA he spent many hours organizing, coaching and managing hockey and baseball teams. He was the SMAA Hockey Man of the Year in 1962 and was instrumental in bringing the Silver Stick hockey tournament to Sarnia. He also managed or coached several provincial championship teams.

TOM NORRIS

Injuries received during the war curtailed his athletic career but he became active in organizing junior B hockey in Sarnia. He was the manager of the Sailors between 1947 and 1949 and the Legionaires from 1951 until 1961. During this time they won three provincial junior B titles.

ROY CALEY

Best known as a sports broadcaster on CHOK radio, he was a founder of the Silver Stick hockey tournament in Watford and was co-founder and chairman of the Alvinston to Watford Road Race for 30 years. An active athlete in his younger days, he has won countless accolades this decade for his longtime contributions to sports and to Lambton County.
