Marciniszyn and Parkkila are perfect:



Mike Marciniszyn and Justin Parkkila shared the honours for the high single in Lambton County Tenpin Association (LCTA) bowling action this past



week as they both recorded perfect games.

Mike Marciniszyn fired his perfect game in the Sunday Morning Men's League at Marcin Bowl. He accomplished the gem on lanes 25 & 26 in his last game of the day finishing with a 771 (225-246-300 – 76 pins over average) triple which was also good for the high triple of the week in the LCTA. He now has 10-300's to his credit. Mike is an example of one of the many adult bowlers who have obtained their bowling skills through Lambton County youth bowling programs over the years. He only bowls once a week but is such a strong opponent on the lanes carrying a 224 average this year after 72 games.

Justin Parkkila rolled his perfect game in the LCTA Handicap Doubles Tournament which was held Feb.22/23 at Marcin Bowl. He performed the feat on lanes 21 & 22 in his second game of the day finishing with a 714 (185-300 - 229) triple. He now has 3-300's to his credit. Justin also posted the fourth high triple of the week as he rolled 754 (266-



232-256) in the Thursday Night Mixed League at Marcin Bowl. Justin is one of the many great bowlers that have come through the Hi-Way Bowl Phantoms Youth Bowling Program under the watchful eyes of Shirley and Mel Matthews who have done an incredible job for countless years. Parkkila started bowling when he was 6 years old and has been enjoying the fun on the lanes for 28 years even though he hasn't carried an average since 2016 due to injuries. Justin said his uncle "Jim Lapointe" got him interested in the game and his favourite spectator was his mom "Kathy" who watched him every week and every tournament. He said his recent interest and drive for bowling is coming from having fun going to different tournaments in Ontario and Michigan with his cousin Ben Lapointe. One of his recent tournaments was the Molson Masters Scratch Tournament in Windsor at Rose Bowl Lanes where he qualified in 5th place for 39 qualifying spots with 1111 (168 -227-248-246-222) on very difficult lane conditions. Six bowlers from Sarnia qualified for match play competition in that tournament but failed to make it to the step ladder finals. Parkkila is only bowling full time in the Cowboys And Indians League this year at Port Huron Lanes carrying a 209 average for 66 games. He is on a team with Ralph MacDuff, Jamie Ridealgh, Bill Ridealgh and Jim Creasor.

Lapointe a close second:

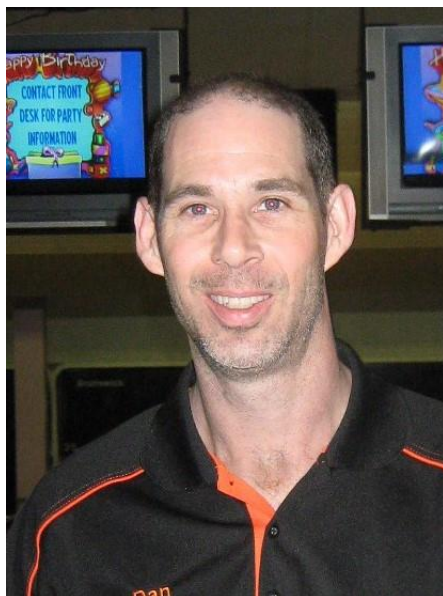
Ben Lapointe tossed 770 (247-245-278 – 131 pins over average for three games) in the RCAFA 403 Wing Mixed League at Hi-Way Bowl to register the second high triple of the week in LCTA bowling action. Lapointe also rolled 725 (225-244-256) in the Bluewater Monday Night Men's League (BMNML) this week. This writer missed counting one of Lapointe's Youth 700 triples this year, so with his great effort in the RCAFA League and the BMNML this week, chalk up three more to his credit. He now has 40 -700's (13 – youth league and 27 - adult Leagues). He is currently averaging 213 after 25 weeks in the RCAFA league and 220 after 24 weeks in the BMNML. Lapointe was another bowler from Sarnia who recently participated in the Molson Masters Tournament in Windsor. He qualified in 8th position with 1087 (265 – 207 - 204 – 207 - 204) a few pins



behind Jordan Croskery also from Sarnia who qualified in 7th position with 1092 (232 - 167 - 241 - 235 - 217).

Chopp is third:

Chopper has 8-300’s to his credit having bowled three of them in the Border City Men’s League in the 2015-2016 season. He also rolled a 300 in the BCML in the 2014-2015 season. However, he is still trying to catch the very difficult 800 series – every competitive bowler’s dream. He is averaging 212 for 72 games this year in the BCML.

Plumb takes fifth place:

Larry Plumb hurled 745 (234-279-232) in the Sunday Morning Men’s League (SMML) at Marcin Bowl to register the fifth high triple of the week. Larry is another talented bowler who came up through the Hi-Way Bowl Youth Bowling Program. He is a right handed bowler who usually delivers an aggressive first ball shot between the 5-10 boards with a ton of speed. He is averaging 222 after 75 games in the SMML. Larry has 7-300’s and 6-800’s under his belt in league and tournament action that this writer is aware of in the Canadian Tenpin Federation and the defunct American Bowling Congress.



Legault leads the way for the ladies:

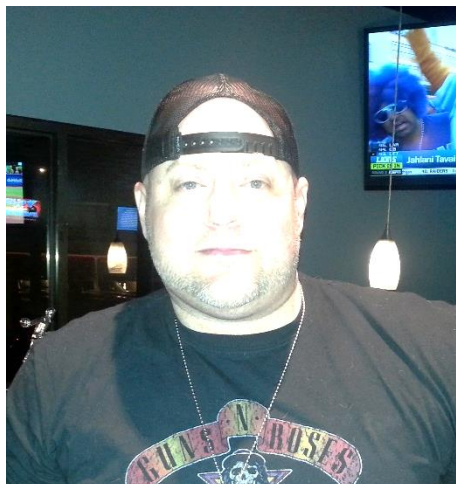
Karyne Legault wheeled 700 (279-217-204) in the Tuesday Night Ladies League (TNLL) at Marcin Bowl to lead the way this week for the ladies in LCTA activity. For the second week in a row she was the ladies top bowler as last week she rolled 696 (224-214- 258) in the TNLL. The right handed bowler is having an excellent year as she is averaging 213 after 60 games.

Stonehouse tops personal single game:

Rob Stonehouse fired a 258 single in the LCTA Handicap Doubles Tournament at Marcin Bowl to register

his personal highest single game squeaking by his previous 257. Stonehouse did not come up through a youth bowling program but got interested in the game when he went to Rock & Bowl with his friends a few times while also testing out the lanes at Lakeside Bowl and Northgate Bowl when they were still going strong. He started bowling in organized league play at about the age of 30 around 1995 participating in three leagues. After bowling four seasons he found that his shift work was playing havoc with his bowling so he took a twenty year break from bowling and returned last season in the Triple A Mixed League at Marcin Bowl. This year he is currently averaging 184 after 57 games in the TAML. Some of his other interests include participating in pick up hockey and watching baseball and NASCAR races.



Hennaert is high over average:

Brett Hennaert rolled 583 (230 – 89 pins over average – 160 pins over average for three games) in the Border City Men’s League at Marcin Bowl to take ownership of the week’s high over average category. Brett is only sparing in the league this year and is carrying a 154 average for 12 games.

Sinclair finishes strong:

Neil Sinclair started his night on the lanes with a rough first game. The game included a couple splits, a few 10-pins held together with four strikes and a score of 170 to start the night. Not a good way that all competitive bowlers like to start their league. However what happened next was an eye popping performance by this solid right handed bowler. In game number two, Sinclair fired eleven strikes in a row only to leave the wide open split 6-7-9-10 on his last shot for a 296. All the bowlers who have been in that situation before know the disappointment when not all the pins fall down on that last shot. When all the clapping and handshakes stopped, Sinclair started game number three. Once again after eleven consecutive strikes using his “radical conspiracy” bowling ball, Neil found himself in the same situation as game two. I’m sure he probably was thinking to himself - slow to the foul line, hit my spot and good follow through with a rolling ball should do it. However, the result was an unrelenting, unapologetic 10-pin standing firm; a right handers nightmare. Oh so close again – 299. The excitement and disappointment again went through his mind with the clapping and handshakes taking place again. Not every day you see a bowler post a 765 triple after starting out with a 170 game and then roll 22 out of a possible 24 strikes in the last two games. Sinclair was bowling in the Thursday



Night Cowboys And Indians League in Port Huron at Port Huron Lanes. He is currently averaging 209 for 66 games in the league. Oh ya by the way, Neil has a career sanctioned 11-300's to his credit recorded in league and tournament action in the Canadian Tenpin Federation, the defunct American Bowling Congress and the new United States Bowling Congress.

Pinel is top youth bowler:



Ryan Pinel wheeled 672 (211-207-254 – 60 pins over average) in the Youth Intermediate Division at Marcin Bowl to post the youth high triple of the week in the LCTA. Ryan started hitting the lanes in the Marcin Bowl Youth Bowling Program in the 2012-2013 in the Senior Bantams Division ending the year with a 78 average. Last year in the Juniors Division he finished the year with a 179 average for 84 games. This year Ryan is having a solid year on the lanes as he is averaging 193 after 69 games. Ryan's personal highest scores are 679 and single game 276. He is another example of a young bowler who has strengthened his bowling skills the last seven years under the guiding eyes

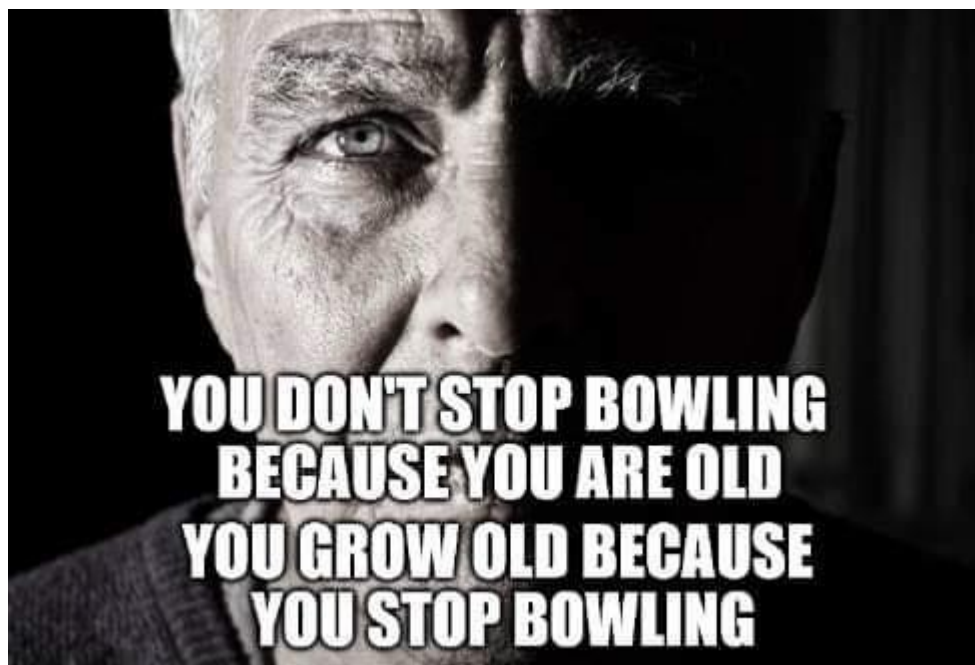
